The focus of this maths challenge is addition and subtraction using money.

Maths Challenge Success Criteria (S.C.):

- ❖ I can count the total amount of money made by one type of coin
- ❖ I can count the total amount of money made by different coins
- ❖ I can estimate how much change will be given after a purchase

Please can you encourage or help your child to carry out these challenges to practice their counting skills.

To help your child practice addition and subtraction with money you could:

- **Play shops (take turns to be the shop keeper and customer)**
- **Count how much of each coin is in your purse**
- **Let your child pay in a shop and estimate the change that will be given**

Make up some of your own activities and let us know how you got on!

You can record what you did in any way you like – bring in the sheet you recorded it on, or even photographs that shows what you did to show the class, get a sticker and the chance to be ... **“Mathematician of the Week”**
